2. IT Security: Gerard Cochran discussed the top information security concerns at UTEP:
  - Backups:* Data integrity is vital, ergo backups are critical. We also need to test data to insure integrity of data.
  - Malware:* Any computer used to surf the internet is vulnerable to Malware.
  - Data Stores:* Don't make too many copies because you might leave them insecure. Data is vulnerable to theft.
  - Access Controls:* Don't let others use your password/pins/etc. There is software that will allow you to create a virtual safe to store that information in.
  - System Monitoring:* They monitor key (4) systems. System administrators should be monitoring their own systems.
  - Encryption:* Encryption will protect your data even if it gets lost. There are free products that will allow you to encrypt your data on computers/flash drives/etc. Beware, if you lose the key you will lose the data.
  - Application Patching:* Single largest problem, people don't load the patches which leave their computers vulnerable.Gerard Cochran also discussed Information Security services that the Office of Information Security is offering, including: Vulnerability Assessment; Penetration Testing; Laptop Encryption; Systems Monitoring Training; Security Training for System Administrators, etc. See [admin.utep.edu/iso](http://admin.utep.edu/iso) for more information.
